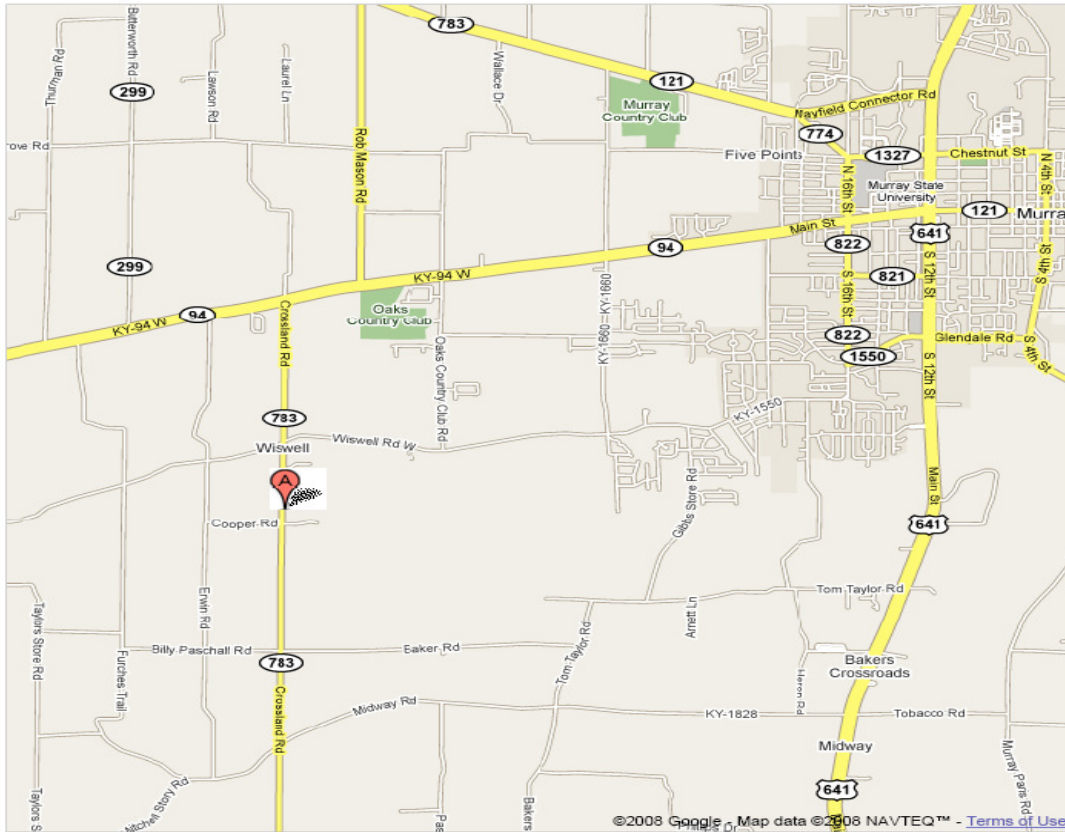
**MENU:** BBQ Half Chicken, beans, slaw, potatoes, cobbler

**From Murray** – Take 94 West ~3.5 miles. Turn left on KY-783. Go 1.7 miles to house on left.

**From Paducah** – Take I-24E 13.5 miles to Purchase Parkway S. Proceed 10 miles to US-641S, 19 miles to 94W. See directions from Murray.

**From Jackson** – Take US-45N ~20 miles to Milan. Take TN-76N/US-79 36 miles to US-641N. Proceed ~15 miles and turn left on KY-893/TN-893. Proceed 4 miles and turn right on KY-783N. Proceed 4 miles. House on right.

**From Martin** – Take TN-22 5 miles to Dresden. Take TN-89 18 miles. Road # changes to KY-381, proceed 4.5 miles & turn right on KY-94. Proceed 11 miles & turn right on KY-783. Proceed 1.7 miles to house on left.

**Night Fish:** Based in western Tennessee and Kentucky the Nightfish band has been around for 20 years. They started out as a three-piece band and recently added a keyboard player. They are mostly a blues band, but also play some rock and a little country. They play a lot of their own songs, but also cover a lot of the greats like Stevie Ray Vaughn, Wilson Pickett, Ray Charles, Carl Perkins, Otis Redding, Marshall Tucker Band, Santana, and The Band.
